ORDINANCE NO. 7

HALF MOON BAY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

AN ORDINANCE OF THE HALF MOON BAY FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT ADOPTING A UNIFORM FEE SCHEDULE FOR PLAN CHECKING AND INITIAL INSPECTION OF BUILDING CONSTRUCTION WORK WITHIN THE DISTRICT.

The Board of Directors of the Half Moon Bay Fire Protection District does ordain as follows:

Section I. Statutory Authority. This ordinance is pursuant to the authority granted to the Half Moon Bay Fire Protection District, (hereafter "District") under Govt. Code \$6103.7 and Health and Safety Code \$13852 et seq., which authorize the District to impose a reasonable and non-discriminatory inspection fee to defray the costs of plan checking and initial inspection services for fire safety hazards and fire protection systems in building construction work performed within the boundaries of the District.

Section II. <u>Procedure</u>. The following procedure is hereby adopted for conducting plan checking and inspection services and charges for such service.

- A. To obtain fire department approval, one set of plans shall be submitted to the fire department prior to construction or modification to the building. The set of plans shall:
- Identify and describe the work to be covered.
- 2. Describe land on which the work is to be done.
- 3. Indicate the use or occupancy for which the proposed work is intended.
  - 4. State square footage of the proposed work.
- B. Fee. The appropriate fee for each plan check and initial inspection pursuant to the schedule in Section 3 shall be paid to the District at the time the plans are submitted.

DA:GFC/lm 5/20/80 C. Inspection. Initial inspection shall be made by the department as required during the course of construction and at the time of final completion of all work.

Section III. <u>Establishment of Uniform Plan Check and</u>

<u>Fee Schedule</u>. The following fee schedule for plan checking and initial inspection services is hereby adopted:

Section IV. Notice. The Board of Directors of the District hereby directs the Fire Chief to notify the San Mateo County and City of Half Moon Bay Building Departments of the existence and effective date of this ordinance in order that its provisions may be implemented and applied to those new buildings, additions to existing buildings, and remodeling of existing buildings proposed to be built or remodeled, as defined in Section 5 below, within the District on or after the effective date of this ordinance.

Section V. Scope of Ordinance. The provisions of this ordinance shall apply to commercial buildings, assembly buildings, multiple dwellings consisting of three or more units, flammable liquid, flammable liquid gases, and hazardous materials installations.

Residential, commercial, and industrial subdivisions included.

Single family or duplex residences are outside the scope of this ordinance.

Section VI. Approval of Plans and Systems. Construction of new buildings or additions or remodeling to existing buildings shall not commence until the plans and specifications have been approved by the District.

Section VII. Change of Fee Schedule. The District reserves the right to amend the foregoing fee schedule depending upon any increased costs incurred by the District in performing such services.

Section VIII. <u>Effective Date</u>. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after its passage and within 15 days of passage shall be published once with the names of the Directors voting for and against it in the Half Moon Bay Review, a newspaper of general circulation in the District.
