B. <u>First Reading and Introduction of Ordinance 2022-03; An Ordinance Adopting the California Fire Code 2022 Edition and Prescribing Regulations Governing Conditions Hazardous to Life, Property and Environment from Fire, Panic, Explosion, Hazardous Materials and Hazardous Uses and Establishing a Bureau of Fire Protection and Providing Officers therefore.</u>

Fire Captain Pat Griffin introduced the Ordinance and recommended the Board approve for second reading.

Board discussion occurred. Director Stockman asked if there are any changes in the Fire Code that staff sees an impact on man hours. Fire Captain Pat Griffin said no, not with the changes but there is a lot of building coming up that is keeping staff busy.

Sid Young spoke about the candidate forum in Half Moon Bay and the comment by a candidate on the way to help with emergency evacuation would be to use the fire roads. Does Chief Cox agree with that? Is this part of the Fire Code?

Deputy Chief Jonathan Cox indicated this is not part of the Fire Code. Land use planning and access roads defers to County Planning. Fire roads are private property and not a public right-of-way for public to pass through.

President Burke asked if there are any notable amendments. Fire Captain Pat Griffin indicated there has been an adjustment to align with the County Building Department on how the need for fire sprinklers is determined.

Director Stockman indicated there hasn't been a meeting, but the Committee will discuss holding a meeting.

G. <u>Emergency Preparedness Liaison Report</u>

Director Stockman indicated Dave Cosgrave spoke about his new role and how it benefits the community as a whole. New Department of Management used to be under the Sheriff's Department and now it falls under the County Executive and Board of Supervisors. Current projects are repairs to the tsunami sirens, trying to improve the SMC Alert system, and evacuation with vegetation management. He summarized the additional speakers on local emergency equipment from other agencies.

H. CERT Report

Director Sherrill indicated they have grown from 150 members from May 2, 2019, to over 2,000 members. They have created an outline to successfully serve local events as volunteers.

I. <u>Attorney's Report</u>

J. Fire Marshals Report

Fire Captain Pat Griffin provided statistics for the month. They attended the Pumpkin Festival. He spoke about the bigger projects moving forward.

K. <u>Fire Chiefs' Report</u>

Deputy Chief Jonathan Cox indicated regarding administration, they are continuing to discuss matrixes to keep coverage for equipment between stations. He spoke with the new Sheriff's Captain to have a monthly meet and greet. The vegetation management abatement notices were sent out. Regarding staffing, hiring for fire apparatus engineers will start next week. They are interviewing for a new position behind the Fire Marshal.

Regarding outreach, Station 41 Open House is on November 12, 2022. Fire Marshal's office has asked to close Obispo Road so there is room for parking.

Regarding operations, there was a significant vehicle accident on Highway 1. There were a lot of vehicle/bicyclists accidents throughout the County.

Regarding training, the training office posted a drone training class for new operators. It was attended by local and outside agencies. The County got a grant for 5 additional drones on the county side so there are 8 drones for use throughout the area. Rescue Intervention Class and Advanced Paramedics classes were held.

Regarding facilities, Chief Gary Silva is working on an RFP for landscaping and fencing at Station 40. The Starlink satellite internet has been received and will be installed at Station 40. There have been meetings with the County about the empty parcel of land and there is a sidewalk showing on the County's plans. There is no funding for it. They decided to prepare two plans; one that shows what the District owns and one that shows that area plus the area of the right-of-way to see if there is funding for the County's area.

Regarding apparatus, Engine 41 is back from annual maintenance and Engine 44 is back from annual maintenance. ERV is being outfitted. Two vehicles have an end of November delivery date and Engine 40 is still at the shop getting its new engine.

President Burke asked a question about the sidewalk on the parcel and maybe preparing a letter to the Supervisor about the safety of a sidewalk in that area.

Deputy Chief Jonathan Cox spoke about the Station 41 Open House itinerary. A press release went out on social media and will be in the Half Moon Bay Review. President Burke asked to reach out to other local districts to invite them to the event.

Director Stockman asked about water safety event on the coast and did anything come up for the District to be a better participant in that event or any blank spots that could be filled. Deputy Chief Jonathan Cox provided a summary of the event. Chief Gary Silva identified that they are going to be discussing an MOU with the Harbor District for what happens when they use the boat in a training.
